## THE NEXT ANNUAL TOWN ELECTION IS TUESDAY, May 19, 2020

Town Wide Officers are elected to staggered terms annually in May. The Town Bylaw requires the annual town election to be held the third Tuesday in May (Approved by the voters at the Annual Town Meeting of May 8, 2017 and approved by the Attorney General on September 11, 2017). Polls are open between Noon and 8:00 pm at the Dunstable Free Public Library.

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION CONCERNING NOMINATION PAPERS

The Town Clerk shall not furnish blank forms for nomination of candidates for town office to any person other than a candidate seeking such nominations or a person presenting the signed authorization of a candidate to secure said forms on his/her behalf. (53:17). A minimum of 20 signatures from registered voters within the town are required though it is recommended you obtain more.

Each candidate shall file with the Town Clerk prior to obtaining blank nomination papers, a statement containing his/her name and address, and the office for which he/she intends to be a candidate. The candidate will supply name, address, phone, and sign for the papers. This information is a public record. No candidate for town office shall receive more blank nomination papers than will contain the number of signatures required to place his/her name in nomination, multiplied five. (53:9A)

No nomination paper shall be received or valid unless the written acceptance of the candidate thereby nominated shall be filed therewith. (53:9)

Elected members are considered Special Municipal Employees by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and must submit annual receipt of the Conflict of Interest Summary and Conflict of Interest Online Training every two years.
