Tiffany Naughton:

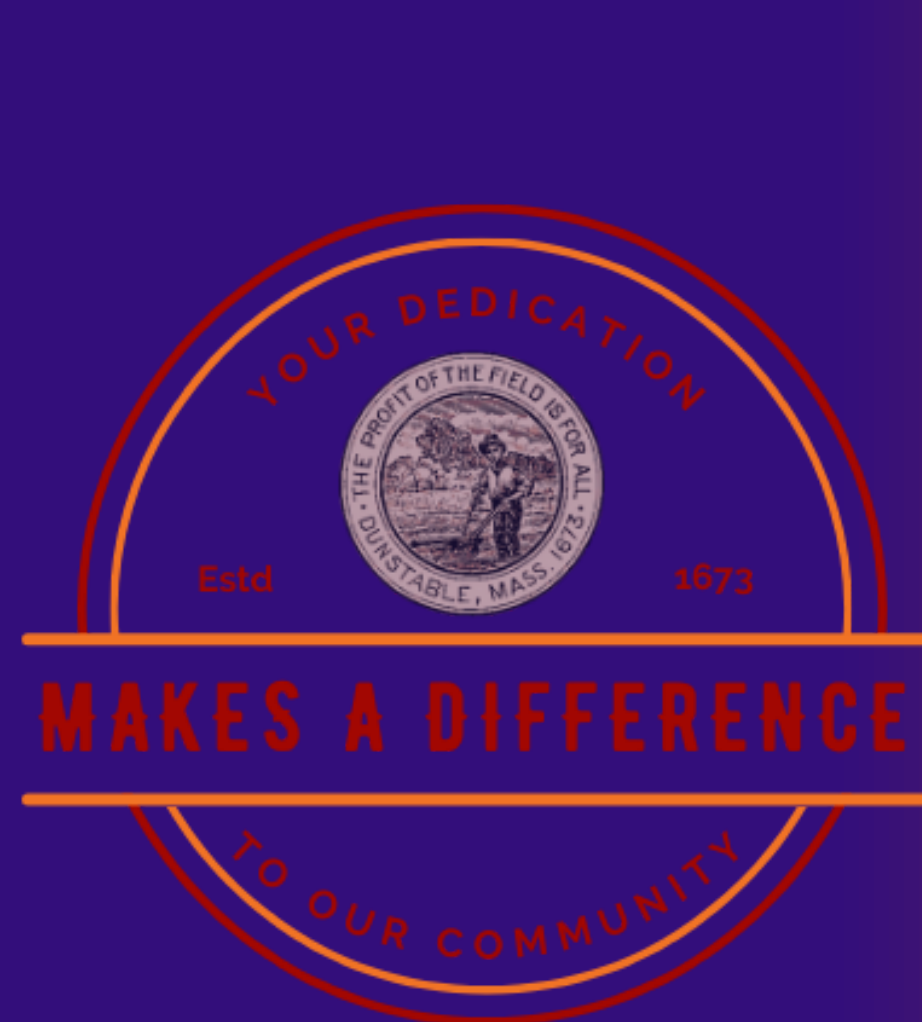
