Open Space, Conservation Areas, and Fields

Dunstable prides itself with the many preserved open spaces, conservation lands, and agricultural fields and forests that provide opportunities for outdoor recreation, nature appreciation, and wildlife habitat. These areas are preserved to maintain the natural beauty, environmental benefits and to provide the community with an opportunity to enjoy nature. They are vital to maintaining the town's rural character while offering a range of recreational opportunities for visitors of all ages.

There are several popular destinations including the Flat Rock Conservation Area, the DRLT Wildlife Refuge and the Spaulding-Proctor Reservation which offer passive activities like hiking, bird-watching, and nature exploration. In winter, the trails are often used for cross-country skiing and snowshoeing. Another gem is the Arched Bridge Conservation Area, where trails lead visitors to the iconic arched stone bridge and then along an old railroad bed. Side trails lead to an abandoned granite quarry and along the wetlands of Salmon Brook. Salmon Brook, the prominent river flowing through the middle of Dunstable, and the Nashua River, a designated Wild and Scenic River on the western Town border, are ideal for fishing and kayaking.

Horse Hill Quarry is a beautiful rocky area that leads into an extensive wildlife management area owned by Massachusetts Department of Fish and Wildlife. Other popular destinations are the Nashua River Rail Trail, Pierce Town Forest and Blanchard Hill for those looking for an outdoor activity.

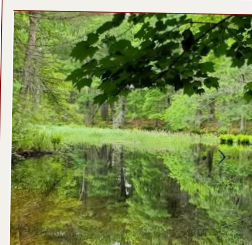
For those interested in Dunstable's agricultural heritage, simply driving around town one will see the vast fields of the Tully Farm, McGovern Farm and several others, which provide a glimpse into the towns farming history and present agricultural activity.

As the main active recreational area in Dunstable, Larter Field hosts soccer and baseball fields, a basketball court, tennis and pickle courts, play structure, and track loop around the property. Families can also enjoy Swallow Union Playground.

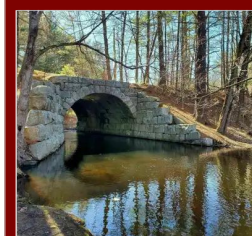

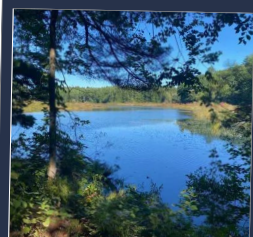

Trash and Recycling Collection

SUBSCRIPTION PROGRAM

The Dunstable Board of Health offers a trash and recycling subscription program. The Town's contracted trash hauler is G.W. Shaw and Sons. The annual trash fee is \$360 per household and each participating resident is supplied with a 64-gallon recycling container and 32-gallon trash container. Overflow bags are sold at Dunstable Town Hall. They are sold in packs of 5 for \$15. Residents can sign-up anytime during the year and will be charged a prorated fee based on a \$30 charge per month.

Program subscribers can make their trash payments online on the Town's website, by mail, or by dropping their payment off at Town Hall or in the payment drop box outside of Town Hall. For subscriber renewals, the trash service runs from July to June based on the Town's fiscal year. Renewal payments must be made by June 30, or a \$30 late fee will be imposed.

Recycling is co-mingled or single-stream collection conveniently allowing for all recycling material to be mixed in the container. Weekly curbside collection occurs on Thursdays. Trash containers should be at the curb no later than 7 AM on Thursday.

To register for a library card, a Dunstable resident needs to:

Present a current valid driver's license with a current Dunstable address or a current valid government issued photo ID with a current Dunstable address.

Alternatively, if neither of those can be provided, a resident may present a current valid driver's license or a government-issued photo ID and one of the following with a current Dunstable address:

- Property tax bill
- Excise tax bill
- Utility bill
- Car registration
- Renter's lease
- Postmarked mail

Voter Registration

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Annual Town Meeting
Second Monday of May
Annual Town Election
Third Tuesday of May

Any Dunstable resident who is a U.S. citizen and at least 18 years old, is eligible to vote in Dunstable. If you are not yet 18 years old, but will be on or before the next election, you can register to vote by the deadline. You may also pre-register to vote if you are 16-17 years old.

Voters do not need to register annually. If voters continue to answer the annual town census and do not move to another town or city, they may continue to vote in Dunstable and participate in Town Meeting.

Prior to state and local elections, there is a deadline to register to vote for that election 10 days prior.
